How it works

The New Enterprise Allowance Scheme offers people who are currently unemployed, support and funding to get their business ideas off the ground.

What does a mentor do?

Entrepreneurs starting up their business under NEA need mentoring support at a critical time during the development of their business plan.

A mentor provides this support usually for an 8 week period. It's not time consuming and most mentors give around an hour or two a week at times to suit them.

You can gain from the experience of being a mentor, and it can be as rewarding as getting your own business going.
